


BOOKS OF THE MONTH



LUCKY – CHRISTY MADIN

Lucky just might be the luckiest pearl in the ocean...or not? A pearl named Lucky sets off in search of a new home after her home is crushed by trash. While looking for a place to live, Lucky bumps into a certain someone and discovers something even better than a shiny new shell: friendship. Lucky is the perfect story to show the harmful effects of ocean pollution and models how materials can be reused rather than thrown away. Dynamic backmatter provides further details on the environmental crisis and how readers can prevent and reverse ocean pollution.



KIMMI – FAVEL PARRETT

On the night of a full moon, a small tropical dingo cub is born. And it is her destiny to travel far from home to change things for her kind. Kimmi sleeps with her mama at her back, her aunty at her front and her three brothers squeezed in beside her. They are a family. But when the farmer who took her father returns to threaten the rest of them, Kimmi is separated from her mama. In an incredible act of determination, Kimmi's mama runs over mountain tops and dusty red earth to spend one last day with her cub and share with her the knowledge that will one day make her a queen. This is Kimmi's story, the story of how she became Queen of the Dingoes in a sanctuary that saves them from extinction. It is her mama's story, too. But mostly it is a story that goes back thousands of years, and follows the long line of female dingoes they belong to.



BEE MILES – ROSE ELLIS

The untold story of the uncompromising and fearless woman who captivated mid-20th century Australia with her spectacular acts of defiance.

Bee Miles was a truly larger-than-life character. Famous for being outrageous in public, or, as she said, living 'recklessly', she shocked and intrigued cities and towns across Australia. But she was no ordinary wanderer.

Born into a wealthy family, Bee moved in Sydney's literary and artistic circles in the 1920s and 1930s before she took up residence on the streets. A consummate performer and a perceptive critic, she caught the public's imagination with her spectacular acts of defiance, emerging majestically from the surf with a knife strapped to each thigh, stopping a country train in its tracks, hitchhiking across remote Australia and drawing large city crowds with her Shakespeare recitations. She was once even voted more famous than the Prime Minister. She was also repeatedly incarcerated in prisons, confined to mental hospitals and treated brutally by a succession of authority figures, starting with her father.

Bee constantly defied conventional expectations of female behaviour. The public found her captivating and fragments of her story have been told again and again in many forms. Until now, no-one has uncovered the real story behind the colourful legend. This first full biography offers a fascinating glimpse into a dark side of Australia's history.

REMINDER

The Carnarvon Dental Therapy is closed from Friday 22/9/23 until around June 2024.

In the case of emergency, treatment for children can be accessed from the General Dental Clinic at the Hospital 99416690 (if staffed) or a Private Dentist. If eligible for the Medicare Child Dental Benefit Scheme, they can claim up to \$1,000 of treatment per child over 2 years from a Private Dentist. (If unsure, they can contact Medicare).

Unfortunately, ongoing acute staff shortages are making it very difficult to provide an adequate service in Carnarvon.

Mexican Chicken Noodle Soup

INGREDIENTS

- 1 tbsp olive oil
- 1 brown onion, finely chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, crushed
- 1L (4 cups) chicken stock
- 2 small chicken breast fillets
- 2 x 400g cans crushed tomatoes
- 1 tsp chipotle sauce
- 135g (1 1/2 cups) dried short cut angel hair pasta
- 400g can black beans, rinsed, drained
- 75g (1/2 cup) frozen corn kernels

INSTRUCTIONS

step 1

Heat the oil in a large saucepan over medium-high heat. Add the onion and cook, stirring, for 4 - 5 minutes or until soft. Add the garlic and cook for 30 seconds or until aromatic. Add the stock and chicken. Cover and bring to the boil. Reduce the heat to low. Uncover and gently simmer for 10 minutes or until the chicken is cooked through. Transfer the chicken to a plate and use 2 forks to shred.

Step 2

Add the tomato and chipotle sauce to the stock mixture and bring to the boil over medium-high heat. Add the pasta and cook, stirring often, for 5 minutes or until just al dente. Return the chicken, with the beans and corn. Stir until warmed through.

Step 3

Divide soup among serving bowls. Top with sour cream and coriander. Season with freshly ground black pepper, to serve.

2024 New Year Stargazing!

with Carol Redford and Donna Vanzetti, Astrotourism WA

2024 will bring a 'cosmic treasure trove' of stunning astro events throughout the year. We can look forward to more amazing meteor showers, a special line-up of planets, Super Moons and more!

To bring in the new year, January has two lovely conjunctions to look for, starting with brilliant Venus sitting only 5 degrees from the thin slither of the Moon. The time is 45mins before dawn on the 9th, looking to the east. This is followed by a stunning meeting of the half moon and Jupiter in the evening sky on the 18th.


For constellations, Orion the Hunter is a famous summer constellation and is up in the early evening to see now. First thing in the evening, look directly to the east. The brightest star you'll see is Sirius. Directly to the left of Sirius is what is often referred to as the "Saucepan". The "Saucepan" is part of the Orion constellation. There are three bright stars in a fairly straight line that make up the base of the saucepan and a handle sticks out at the top right.

Orion has been known since ancient times. In Greek mythology, Orion is a hunter. His image is upside down in the southern hemisphere! The three bright stars of the base are Orion's belt, and the handle is his sword.

And how about looking at some galaxies! The Large and Small Magellanic Clouds (sometimes abbreviated to LMC and SMC!) are galaxies outside of our own Milky Way Galaxy and form a stunning spectacle. From Earth, they look like two faint clouds in the southern night sky. We are super lucky here downunder as they are only seen from the Southern Hemisphere.

The best time to see the Magellanic Clouds is when there's no moonlight. Look to the south from 8.00pm, between 10–15th January.

Pop these dates into your cosmic diary and have a star-filled New Year!

2024 February Conjunctions & Occultations!

Just as our daylight skies are ever-changing, with new sunsets and shifting cloud formations, our evening skies are constantly changing too, with the Moon, stars and planets providing a smorgasbord of stunning views. During their orbits we see lunar *occultations* (when the Moon, appears to move in front of another, blocking it from view) and *conjunctions* (when two astronomical objects, like planets, appear close together in the sky). And let's not forget the spectacle of meteor showers, there's plenty to see in our night skies!

The Alpha Centaurids meteor shower returns to WA's night skies from 28th January – 21st February, peaking around 8th February. This year's Alpha Centaurids are forecast to produce about 6 meteors per hour. With the shower reaching its highest point after dawn, your best viewing will be in the hours up to around 4am.

When and where to look: Early morning, 8th and 9th February in the south-eastern sky.



On 15th February, the moon is a beautiful waxing crescent — and it's visible in conjunction with the king of the planets, Jupiter, all evening. This conjunction is a good one for naked-eye stargazing or viewing with binoculars. You'll be able to follow the conjunction until the moon sets at 10.29pm and Jupiter follows a few minutes behind.

When and where to look: 7.40pm, 15th February in the north-western sky.

Pop these dates into your cosmic diary and have a star-filled 2024!
