



# **COUNCIL NEWS**

# **CEO Report**

I trust that everyone has had a great festive period and we can now look forward to 2025 and see what eventuates. We are scheduled to have both a Federal and State Election and the results will impact on Local Governments. The Shire President and myself have had meeting with Mem Beard and Melissa Price and we put forward some priorities both at a Federal and State level that will benefit our Shire.

I can concur with Jarrod that we have had a very hot last month with our temps equalling the national record. Although its good to go up in lights I would prefer it for other things as this heat is extremely taxing on our outside staff in particularly Ali, Nat and Brendon.

Over the break I was busy completing our Reg 17 and Financial Management recommendations. The majority are complete just waiting on our joint management review and then we can bring these back to the Audit and Risk Committee for their consideration.

It is pleasing to see that the fruits of our labour over the last three years is starting to bear fruit with the ILUA for the residential land and new waste site all but signed off by the Yinggarda native title holders. Our Town Planning Scheme Amendment No 1 has nearly reached the zenith of the process with only Ministerial approval required, unfortunately now that the State Government are now in "caretaker mode" we shall have to wait until after the election. Once this is done Development WA and the Shire can develop the Commercial lots.

Since our last meeting the Shire have experienced significant damage to our essential public assets have necessitated the Shire activating the DRFAWA. The Shires of Murchison and Carnarvon are also making a claim for this event.

Things are moving along with trying to find a lessee for the Junction Tourist Park. The Shire have appointed a commercial real estate company to market the property, and they will present offers once they are finalised.

Unfortunately, we have had another death out at the Mount. It appears another tourist underestimated the heat and paid the ultimate price. Our most sincere condolences go out to all the family and friends of the deceased.

It has been a month or so of illness cursing through our Administration team with COVID rearing its ugly head. I thought I had managed to dodge this awful infliction over time however, it managed to get me, good, much to the delight of some of my colleagues, and I had to take a week off.

## **Manager of Works and Services Report**

The start to 2025 has been like most years... hot! We are making sure our outside staff are taking measures to keep hydrated and safe during the hot period. Planning our crews work schedule throughout the day to keep them out of the heat in the afternoons and setting realistic expectations has been priority for the management team. The start to the year has as usual been quite busy and reactive. The weather, equipment breakdowns and planned maintenance has thrown a few spanners in the works however the team is still delivering.

We engaged Westrac, Pridham Mechanical and C'von Auto Electrics to carry out planned maintenance at the beginning of January. Most of the work has been completed except for defects that were found along the way. Unfortunately, we had to replace one of our light trailers as the existing water wheel trailer was beyond repair. Some other more significant unplanned repairs included replacing complete axles in a side tipper, full brake replacement on the Mack and clutch replacement in the Kenworth prime mover.

The new 150M grader arrived mid-January and has been put straight to work. The incumbent grader has been taken to Manheim Auctions and will go under the hammer along with the CAT prime mover on the 13th February.

Unfortunately, we have another potential flood damage claim thanks to a rain event just before Christmas. While the event was widespread the bulk of the damage occurred on C'von Mullewa Road, Dooley Downs and Ullawarra Rd. We have submitted our preliminary flood damage notice to DFES and are awaiting a response. The Shires of Carnarvon and Murchison have also submitted claims.

Our graders have tidied up Ullawarra, Landor Meeka and C'von Mullewa roads, they will work their way across to Mt Augustus to complete Dolley Downs. We have engaged Barkly day from Mt Vernon to repair Pingandy Rd and Greg Watters to tidy up the Mt Clere and Waldburg roads. There was significant damaged caused to the Congo Creek concrete crossing on the southern end of the C'von Mullewa Road. Unfortunately, at the time it happened our works crew and contractors had knocked off for the year. As a result, we could not affect adequate repairs until early January. The road was closed to all traffic during this time. Due to pressure to reopen the road and the safety hazard we determined the crossing needed to be repaired under the DRFAWA Immediate Works provisions. As such a RFQ was conducted and Yuin Pastoral will be reinstating the damaged sections of concrete crossing this week. We are also conducting a RFQ for repairs to the bitumen on C'von Mullewa Road.

MTF have returned from the break and picked up from where they left off with the C'von Mullewa bitumen upgrades. They have almost completed the reconstruction of the subbase and will begin importing the basecourse this month. They are on track to complete the project by April/May. Once done there they will mobilise across to the Landor Meekatharra Road to complete our RRG resheeting works.

Our works crew have remobilised back to finish off our RRG Remote Communities resheeting near the Landor racecourse. There is only 2km to be done there before we move over to the C'von Mullewa Road, south of Glenburgh, to complete our R2R resheeting and stabilising project. It will be a big push to complete the works before the end of the financial year.

## **Manager of Finance and Corporate Services**

Happy New Year one and all and hope everyone enjoyed their break.

Our team has hit the ground running and has worked hard bringing all leave accumulated work up to date. Brooke attended Department of Transport training in January and is looking forward to getting to know the system better and being able to provide support to the community. Thank you team you have certainly done well.

No doubt my report will be more detailed as the year progresses.



## **Community Resource Centre Update**

We saw 2024 finish with a fun afternoon of Christmas games and activities for the kids and a successful Community Christmas Party hosted by the Junction Craft Group.

Our GP, Nursing and Physio clinics have recommenced for 2025 with dates locked in for the rest of the year. With the GP clinic on the first Wednesday of every month and Nursing and Physio clinics on the third Wednesday of every month.

# **Tourism & Community Development**

A busy time of the year behind the scenes in tourism as preparation for new tourism assets and marketing campaigns for the region and the Shire are compiled in readiness for the upcoming season. The new Australia's Golden Outback Planner & Map has gone to print, an update to the Wander Outback brochure in readiness for the Perth Caravan and Camping Show and a refresh of the Outback Pathways Guide. The AGO is set to launch the Detour Gascoyne Murchison Campaign in mid February with a focus on digital and radio in the lead up to the Perth Caravan and Camping Show. This year the Shire will be working with the Shire of Carnarvon to collaborate on enticing visitors to our region at the four day event. Data is showing that 62% of our visitors to the Shire of Upper Gascoyne are spending the night before visiting us in Carnarvon and 63% are staying in Carnarvon the night after visiting us in Carnarvon. This collaboration with our neighbors is a trial to see if it is something to continue moving forward at other similar events.

The main focus in January has been on finding new lessee's for the pub and the associated messaging and marketing around this. The appointed broker has a marketing campaign in place and the Gascoyne Development Commission has also offered us support in getting the message out. A campaign has been developed for when business resumes. The Accommodation Capability Program is drawing to a close with great outcomes for participants. A full report will be finalized by March to be presented to council.

Town Signage is in the design phase with a proposed installation date of April/May for the new tourism season. The signage will be part of a walking trail around town and also at the Gascoyne Junction Historical Museum.exploring the region easier for our visitors.

An audit of Outback Pathways signs is also being undertaken, and new signage locations identified to make exploring the region easier for our visitors.


The next meeting in the process of achieving Dark Sky Community Accreditation will be held in mid February with a timeline to be established. Work is underway to coordinate Dark Sky events throughout the Shire over the coming months. Our Music in the Park series to be held on the 4th Saturday of the month from May through September is coming together with acts locked in for May and June.

Preliminary meetings in regards to the Gascoyne Arts Strategy have begun and a submission from the Shire towards the literature review has been submitted. Consultants will be in Gascoyne Junction for a day mid March to undertake a community consultation process. The visit for the Gascoyne will coordinate with visits to the Shire of Carnarvon and Shark Bay.

# Shire of Upper Gascoyne

**State Election Priorities** 

# Priority 1: Sealed Road Construction & Preservation

**Problem:** The extraordinary costs for remote Local Governments associated with getting stone, bitumen and labour to either initially seal a road or reseal a road is two to three times greater than that of our Metro/Southwest Local Governments.

**Solution:** Set up a fund that supports mitigating the cost differential.

## **Priority 2: Heritage Legislation**

**Problem:** Heritage Legislation is restrictive to Local Government.

**Solution:** Heritage Legislation urgently reviewed with Loval Governments being exempt especially for existing borrow its, water points and minor road re-alignments if they are not in a registered 'significant site'.

## **Priority 3: RRG Allocations**

**Problem:** Insufficient funding to preserve road assets for rural / remote LGvt's.

**Solution:** Regional Road Group allocations to metropolitan councils be reduced to 10%

# Priority 4: Emergency Funding (DRFAWA)

**Problem:** Financial burden of Remote Local Governments.

Solution: Reduction of Shire Contributions for remote Local Governments to 2% of rate revenue and only one contribution per annum as we may have multiple events. Overdraft interest should also be included as an expense. Another inclusion should be all overhead costs for Shire Staff as an eligible cost. Cost of road reinstatement due to damage to road caused by repairing flood damaged roads.

### **Priority 5: Staff Housing**

**Problem:** Cost of constructing staff housing for employees.

**Solution:** Include a provision where a remote Local Government can access a fund for the provision of Staff Housing with a maximum amount of \$1M per year. Not for renovations but for new home construction.

## **Priority 6: Native Vegetation**

**Problem:** If Road Reserve not cleared the roads become unsafe due to a poor line of sight and animals feeding on the road verges.

**Solution:** Allow the clearing of native vegetation within existing road reserves.

## **Priority 7: Headworks**

**Problem:** Extreme costs to develop land to be used for housing.

**Solution:** Ensure that Horizon Power subsidise remote Local Governments for the provision of electricity, water and gas rather than using the current cost + methodology.

# Priority 8: Miscellaneous Mining Licences

**Problem:** Mining camps are generally situated on Miscellaneous Mining Licenses and as it stands, we cannot rate them to account for the extra traffic damage to the road infrastructure.

**Solution:** Change the legislation to ensure that Local Governments can rate Miscellaneous Mining Licences.

## **Project Overview**


The upgrade project consists of the upgrade of approx. 10 – 12km of the Carnarvon Mullewa Rd from gravel to seal. The work involves several discontinuous segments east of Pells Crossing and west of Cobra Dairy Creek Rd

The work is funded 100% by Main Roads WA. The earthworks and pavement work is being completed by MTF.

The spray sealing work is to be completed by Colas. Sealing is scheduled for late April 2025.

# Works this period (Dec/Jan 2024-25) The work crew was on break for all of January 2025. Work recommenced early Feb 2025 Re-established work site and waters Recommenced subgrade preparation in the vicinity of the Congo crossing (western and eastern approaches) Hot weather has presented challenges for moisture consistency Estimating bulk of subgrade work will be completed by mid February. Pavement work will commence shortly thereafter.

# New power station for Gascoyne Junction

WESTERN Power will build a new power station at Gascoyne Junction.

Energy Minister Eric Ripper said tenders had been called for power stations fired by either diesel, or a combination of diesel and green power, such as wind or solar energy.

Mr Ripper said the power stations would supply electricity to Western Power at higher environmental standards than existing diesel generators and could lower generation costs.

Upper Gascoyne shire president Ross Collins said consumers in the shire would be grateful for the push to modernise power generation.

"It makes a lot of sense to encourage solar power," he said.

"There are nine months when it is hot and plenty of sun.

The Minister said Western Power would buy the electricity from the privately owned and operated stations and deliver it to customers in the town.

It was expected that construction would begin in January next year for the stations to be operating in October 2005.







Research from the Western Australian Telethon Kids Institute shows that every day at school counts towards a student's learning.



# **Easy Creamy Garlic Prawn**

# **Pasta Bake**

Baked in foil and ready in just 40 minutes, this easy seafood bake is packed with prawns and risoni - perfect for a weeknight dinner.

# **METHOD**

- **1.** Preheat oven to 200°C/180°C fan forced. Cook risoni in a saucepan of boiling water for 4 minutes or until partially cooked. Drain.
- **2.** Meanwhile, combine the cream, stock powder, garlic and mustard in small bowl.
- **3.** Tear four 30cm square sheets of foil. Divide the risoni evenly among the sheets and pull the edges of the foil up slightly. Top the risoni with the prawns and peas. Pour over the cream mixture.
- **4.** Fold the foil and paper to enclose the filling and seal tightly. Place onto a large baking tray and bake for 15 minutes or until the prawns change colour. Sprinkle with parsley and Parmesan to serve.

## **INGREDIENTS**

- 150g (2/3 cup) dried risoni pasta
- 250ml (1 cup) pouring cream
- 2 tsp Chicken Stock Powder
- 2 garlic cloves, crushed
- 1 tsp Dijon mustard
- 600g green prawns, peeled, deveined, tails intact
- 150g (1 cup) frozen peas, thawed (see tip)
- Fresh continental parsley leaves, to serve
- Shaved Parmesan Cheese, to serve

## **RECORD TEMPERATURES**

February saw high temperatures in Gascoyne Junction. On Sunday Feb 3, Gascoyne Junction recorded its highest official temperature with the Bureau of Meteorology at 49 degrees surpassing the previous highest recorded temperature of 48.8 degrees on February 6, 1991.

Not to settle there, the record was broken again on Monday Feb 4, with the mercury reaching 49.2 degrees to set yet another record. According to the Bureau of Meteorology this is the first time two consecutive days of 49 degrees and over has been recorded in Western Australia.



# Overnight oats

## **METHOD**

# step 1

The night before serving, stir the cinnamon and 100ml water (or milk) into your oats with a pinch of salt.

The next day, loosen with a little more water (or milk) if needed. Top with the yogurt, berries, a drizzle of honey and the nut butter.

Overnight oats are basically oats which have been left to soak overnight in milk or water, rather than being cooked in the morning. This no-cook method allows the oats to absorb the liquid overnight and soften them so that they are ready to eat in the morning. This makes overnight oats a quick and easy breakfast option, and you can easily customise them with different toppings and sauces.

- 2 tbsp <u>natural yogurt</u>

- drizzle of <u>honey</u>
- ½ tbsp nut butter





## **Hello Autumn!**

The March or Autumn equinox marks the transition from summer to autumn in the southern hemisphere. It also marks several astronomical phenomena. The Sun rises directly in the east and sets due west. The Sun will also appear exactly halfway between its northernmost and southernmost location in the sky.

The exact time of the March equinox occurs when the sun is directly above the Earth's equator. This year, this occurs on 20th March at 5.01pm for West Australians. The image below shows how seasons progress as Earth orbits the Sun.






