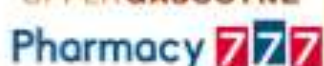

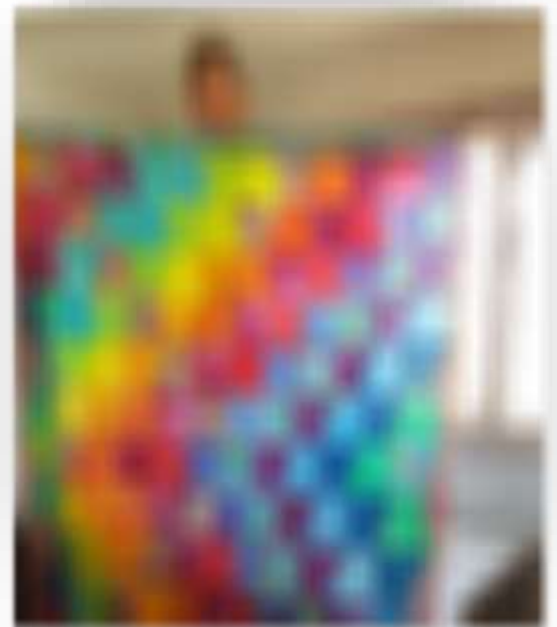
The ladies created some wonderful quilts as you can see in the pictures.

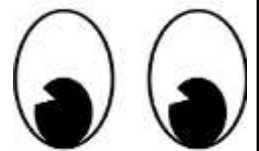

Korean Beef

Ingredients

- 2.5 kg chuck beef steaks, trimmed, cut into 3 cm pieces
- 1 bunch green spring onions (200 g)
- 2 x 100 g sachets Korean BBQ Marinade
- $\frac{1}{3}$ cup mirin
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup light soy sauce
- 2 tbsp ginger paste
- Steamed rice, to serve (optional)
- Sesame seeds, toasted, to serve (optional)

Method

Toss beef in 2 tbsp vegetable oil in a large bowl. Season with salt and pepper.

Heat a large, non-stick frying pan over a high heat.

Add beef in four batches.

Cook, turning occasionally for about 4 to 5 minutes, or until browned all over.

Transfer to a removable bowl of a 5 to 6-litre slow cooker.

Trim onions. Thinly slice white part only, reserving green tops. Combine marinade, mirin, sauce and paste with $\frac{1}{4}$ cup water in a small bowl. Add to slow cooker with onions. Stir to combine. Cover with lid.

Cook on a Low heat for about 6 hours, or until beef is tender.

Thinly slice reserved green tops of onions. Garnish beef with onions and seeds.

Serve with rice.

TIPS

Casserole can be made up to two days ahead. Keep, covered, in the fridge. Reheat before serving.

Vanilla slice with passionfruit icing

Ingredients

- 2 x 200 g packets lattice biscuits
- 2 cups milk
- 1½ cup cream
- 4 egg yolks
- ⅔ cup custard powder
- ½ cup caster sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla essence
- 1 package passionfruit decorating icing

Method

Line the base and sides of a 20cm square pan with baking paper.

Arrange the biscuits in a single layer in the base of the pan, cutting to fit if necessary.

Place milk and cream into a saucepan and bring to the boil. Remove from heat.

Place egg yolks, custard powder, sugar and vanilla into a bowl. Using electric beaters, beat for 2 min until thick and creamy.

Gradually add the hot milk mixture while beating. Transfer to a saucepan and continue to heat over a medium heat, stirring constantly until thickened.

Spread custard over biscuits and smooth the surface.

Top with another layer of biscuits and spread with Passionfruit Icing. Chill until set. Cut into squares to serve.

PASSIONFRUIT ICING

Sift 1½ cups icing sugar into a bowl. Add the pulp from 2 passionfruit and 30g softened butter. Mix well until combined.

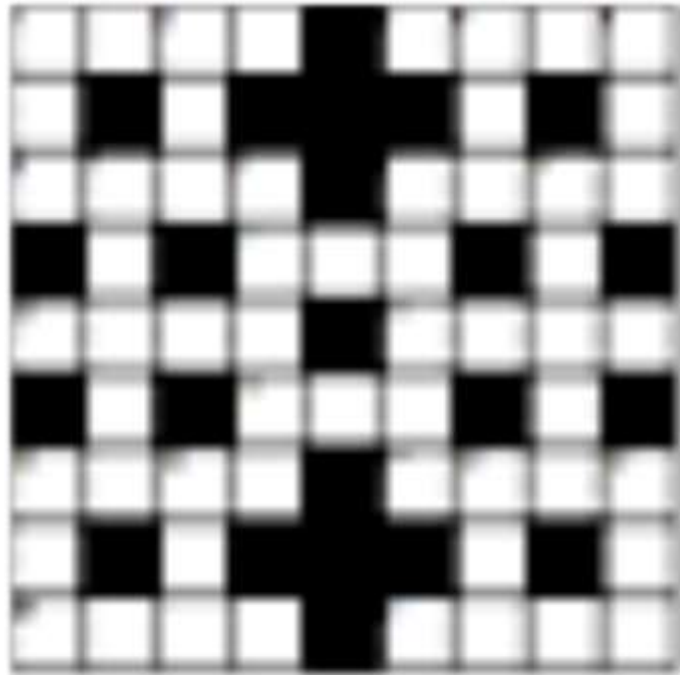

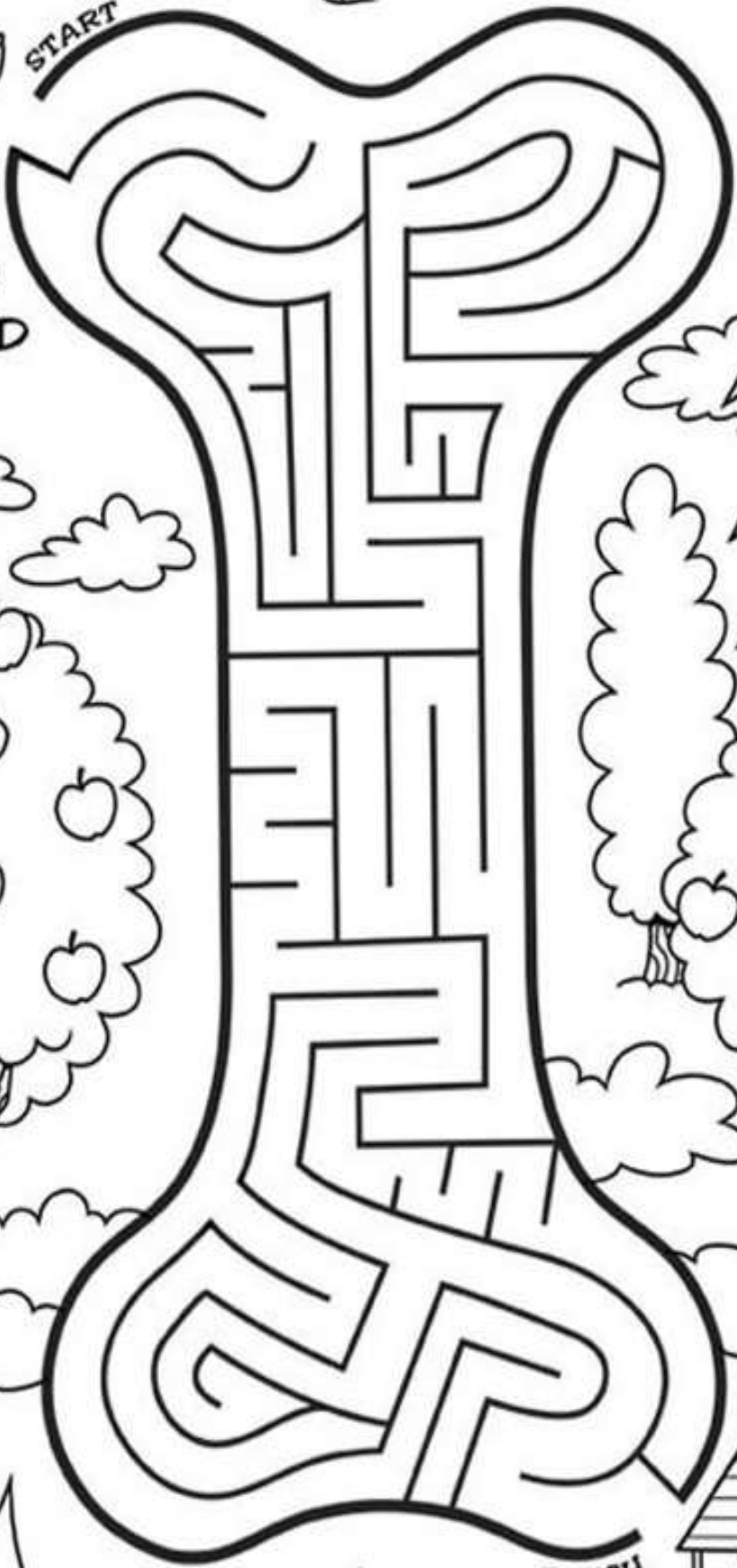

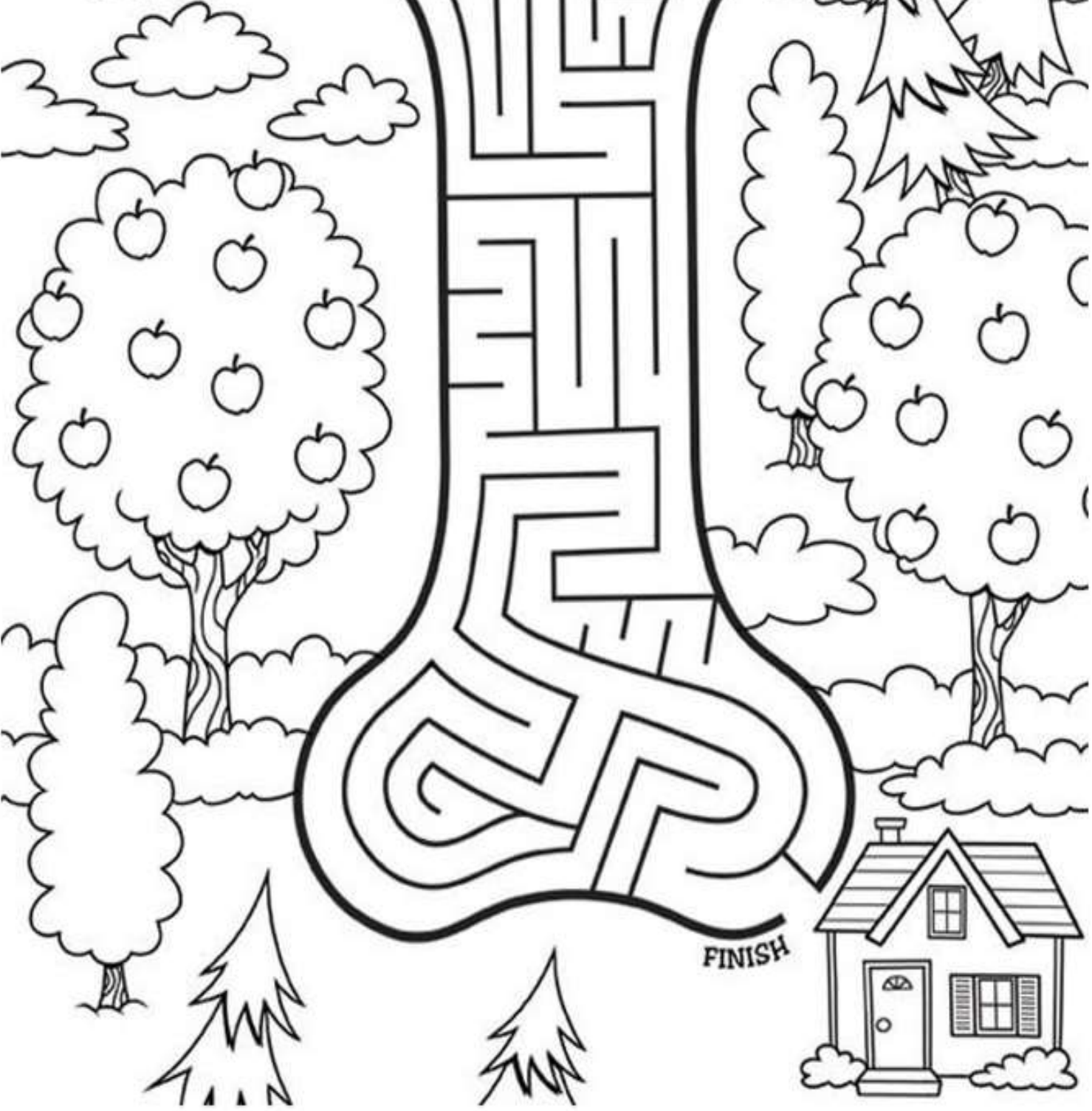
